- Engages over 1,700 athletes through High-Challenge Sports program - adaptive windsurfing, Hawaiian outrigger canoeing, kayaking in partnership with Spaulding Rehabilitation Hospital, Doug Flutie Jr. Foundation for Autism, Perkins School for the Blind among others; Training programs - Personal Training at the YMCA and Sports Training - adaptive soccer, tennis and cycling at various sites.
